


VETERANS DAY HONORING ALL WHO SERVED 11.11.17

Dr. Creg Carpenter joined the U.S. Air Force in 1998 as an Attending Staff Orthopedic Surgeon at Wright Patterson Medical Center. Lt. Col. Michael Wise

Retired U.S. Army Lt. Col. Michael Wise served for over 20 years in the active duty Army in various leadership positions throughout the U. S., Europe, and the Middle East. He served in Germany at the end of the Cold War and deployed to Operation Joint Endeavor in Bosnia-Herzegovina in 1996. Later, he deployed to Baghdad, Iraq during Operation Iraqi Freedom with a follow-up assignment as a command and control communications expert for a counter-insurgency training team preparing U.S. Army units for deployments to Iraq and Afghanistan. He is a graduate of the Command and General Staff College in Ft. Leavenworth, Kansas and currently serves as Assistant Director of Military and Veteran Services at Eastern Michigan University.



Sgt. Justin Peter Godfrey

Justin Peter Godfrey was born June 4, 1984 in Flint, MI. He served eight years in the U. S. Army as an infantryman; scout/sniper; and as an infantry team leader, instructor, and recruiter.

He is a writer, philanthropist, singer, composer, producer, entrepreneur, dancer, servant, student, teacher, a child of The Living God, and a lover of all things good, true, and righteous.

Justin's career pursuit is to be a co-laborer with The Holy Spirit as sculptors of glory-filled atmospheres; and to reveal the love of God to the world–through music, film, writing, and expressions of every kind.
