At North Creek Elementary, books by picture book author and illustrator Dan Yaccarino were dispersed to classroom teachers and the school library. Ruth McNally Barshaw's chapter book series made its way through the classrooms and school library at South Meadows Elementary. At Beach Middle School, William Durbin's historical fiction book, *The Broken Blade*, was incorporated into the curriculum and all 6th grade students had a chance to read it. The authors will be visiting students at their respective schools during Authors in Chelsea on Wednesday and Thursday, March 30-31.
