 The US is falling very far behind and innovation will suffer without widespread, fast, and affordable internet.


Some Sample Comments

- This is very important to me. Without high speed internet it lowers my personality


Washtenaw County Broadband Survey "Need for Service" and Current Use Maps

 - Hover or click on marker to display address


Sylvan Township - Need for Service




Sylvan Township - Technology Type




