Rhyme Time

A song or rhyme with simple motions.

Where is Brown Bear? *Tune of "Where is Thumpkin?"* Where is brown bear? (shrug hands) Where is brown bear? Here I am! (thumbs up) Here I am! How are you this winter? Very tired, thank you. (yawn) Go to sleep. (hand "pillow" to head) Go to sleep.

Ready to Read Create a culture of reading in your home and get your child ready to read by incorporating the 5 Practices of Early Literacy into your daily routines. It's easy and fun!

Read — Encourage extended family members to read together during holiday gatherings.

Write — Have your child help bake and decorate a favorite holiday treat. Rolling out dough, using a piping bag, and adding sprinkles are delicious fine motor skills!

Sing — Share your favorite holiday tunes with your child. Sing in the car while you look at twinkle lights, go caroling in the neighborhood, or just have a sing-a-long at home.

Talk — Talk about your family's holiday traditions and how they came to be.

Play — The holidays bring disruptions to schedules and routines, plus new experiences, foods, and relatives. Role play upcoming scenarios so your child knows what to expect.
