Naomi Shihab Nye is a poet and author of more than 30 works for children, teens, and adults and was honored as the 2019-21 Young People's Poet Laureate by the Poetry Foundation. Ms. Nye uses stories to find the shared humanity that connects us all, and her work is heavily

influenced by her Palestinian-American heritage and world travels. Amongst many other honors, her 2002 poetry collection 19 Varieties of Gazelle: Poems of the Middle East was a finalist for the National Book Award. South Meadows students will be reading some of Ms. Nye's more recent works for children, including the novels The Turtle of Oman and The Turtle of Michigan, and the poetry collections Cast Away and Everything Comes Next. Ms. Nye travels to Chelsea from Texas, and previously she has also called St. Louis and Jerusalem "home."
