- Zinio Digital Magazine Service: Sign up Now!
  - O Chelsea District Library has added digital magazines to our online digital collection. The service, launched May 1, 2014, is offered through a program called Zinio For Libraries, which recreates each magazine page-for-page, including high quality, full-color pictures, while adding interactive components such as key word searches, hyperlinks, and audio and video components. It is free to Chelsea District Library account holders and allows them to download magazines to their computer or favorite digital device from the Library website.

  - o Penal Fines

New discussion has circulated regarding an attempt by some to siphon library funding. Certain penal fines are mandated by the state constitution to fund libraries. These fines make up on average 10% of library funding. A large number of libraries rely on this source of income for 30% or more of their budgets. The elimination of this funding stream would have immediate and severe effect on dozens of libraries. It would cause the elimination of programs, staff, hours and the closure of numerous libraries. Local schools already strapped for resources are closing down school libraries. As public libraries step up to serve those students, further reduction in funding would place many of those efforts in jeopardy.

- New State Librarian
  - Congratulations to Randy Riley on his appointment to the State Librarian position. Randy is a 24-year veteran at the Library of Michigan and will succeed Nancy Robertson, who retired in April. Riley is recognized as a leading family historian and has been the Michigan eLibrary coordinator and also coordinated the Notable Books program and Center for the Book.
