- 2015 Budget Planning Update
 - o Final preparations are being made for the budget hearing on August 26. Terri Lancaster published the annual hearing notice in the Chelsea Standard at the beginning of August. - Summer Reading Program (SRP)
 - Participation in the Library's Summer Reading Program continues to dazzle. Once again, our exceptionally talented staff dedicated themselves all summer to stress the importance of reading while school is not in session. With support from our partners at the Chelsea School District, the summer reading program has helped students stay academically committed for the next school year. Working together, the library was able to realize many of its goals:
 - Make reading for fun a top priority for families this summer.
 - Improve literacy and academic performance by involving children and teens in reading and reading-related activities during the summer months.
 - Foster a love of reading through our programs and services.
 - Increase children's access to library materials and activities, which will encourage them to become lifelong library users.
 - Increase the number of children and teens participating in public library Summer Reading Programs.

- o To demonstrate that we are meeting the goals:
 - Youth Department
 - 1,383 children and teens registered for SRP, a 9% increase over 2013.
 - Adult Department
 - 281 registered for the Adult Program, a 48% increase over 2013!
- 5H Community Read Program
 - The staff and I have been busy making final preparations in anticipation of this year's 5H Community Read. Books will be available to the community for free at several locations, including the Wellness Center, the Library, Zou Zou's, Chelsea Retirement Community, Chelsea Community Hospital, and many more.

 - Collaboration with the Chelsea-Area Wellness Foundation and Chelsea District Library, Dexter District Library, Jackson District Library in Grass Lake, Manchester District Library, and Capital Area District Library in Stockbridge.
 - Multi-year community project focused on engaging, learning, and connecting in healthy ways.

 - The Fault in Our Stars, by John Green.
 - O What is the goal?
 - Bring communities together in dialogue on the topic of wellness.
 - Increased knowledge of how to connect with others in healthy ways.
